CEIP Approval Process

Open Meeting

- Commission discusses plan and comments, makes final decision or sets for hearing
- At least 30 days after comments due

Adjudication

- Only if there are significant unresolved issues
- Formal discovery, testimony, etc.
- Possible Brief Adjudicative Process

Assistance Plus Washington

Funded: \$3.1 million

Eligibility: Residential Customer with

income at less than 200% of Federal Poverty

Administration: Internal and External

Grants

- Maximum amount \$2,500 per account.
- Can reapply for additional grants.
- Automatic grants for customers designated as low-income.
- Automatic grants \$1,433,682.
- Community Action Agencies income qualify customers.
- Arrearage Forgiveness Grants \$1,532,491.
- Approximately \$65,000 dollars remaining.

Consumer Protections:

- Up to 18-month payment plans
- Deposits, late fees, and reconnect fees, and field visit fees waived
- Self-Certification for Medical Certificates
- Expires April 2022

Post Moratorium Protections:

- Prior to disconnecting any residential customer, prior approval must be granted the commission consumer staff
- Developed a process for Pacific Power to refer customers to Community Action Agency
